

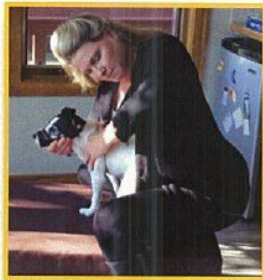

Your animal may benefit from chiropractic care if they exhibit one or more of the following signs:

- Decrease in level of performance, laziness
- Loss of wind capacity
- Problems or difficulty climbing or going down stairs, difficulty jumping on the couch/bed or into the car, difficulty navigating agility obstacles
- Behavioral changes (eg. starting to snap, refusal to play with family members)
- Problems eating or refusing to play with toys, or chewing hard treats
- Short striding, uneven strides, nail dragging, stumbling
- Diagnosed conditions such as degenerative arthritis or degenerative disc disease
- Muscle imbalance, spasms or atrophy
- Incessant licking of paw or leg
- Abnormal posture when standing, standing with hips uneven, not squaring up when urinating, not lifting leg while urinating (when they used to), holding tail to one side or tail always down
- Head tilted to one side, shaking of the head, constant ear problems and/or allergies
- Injuries resulting from falls, training, or other activities
- Stressful situations, including being groomed and boarded, owner being gone for period of time
